Vitalina Alfonso Torres (Havana, 1960) studied philology at the University of Havana with a specialization in Latin American literature. She is currently the editor of *Ediciones Bologna*. She is co-author of the anthology, Cuentos para ahuyentar el turismo. 16 autores puertorriqueños (1991) and author of Narrativa puertorriqueña actual. Realidad y parodia (1994) and Ellas hablan de la Isla (2002). Formerly, she was the editor of the magazine Casa de las Américas and a member of the editorial board for Editorial Arte y Literatura and the literary magazine, Opción. Her writings have appeared in publications such as Annals of the Caribbean, Casa de las Américas, Letras Cubanas, La Gaceta de Cuba, Archipiélago, Lecturer, Revista de Dones i Textualita, Letra de Escriba, Unión and La Siempreviva, among others. In 1990, she was awarded the honorable mention by El Caimán Barbudo, and first prize by *Pinos Nuevos* in 1993. For over 15 years she has participated in numerous lectures, panels, talks and book fairs in Cuba, Mexico, United States, Dominican Republic and Puerto Rico and in 2001, the Cuban Research Institute at FIU sponsored her research project on narrators of the Hispanic Caribbean diaspora. In 2009, she was awarded a Creative Grant from la Asociación de Crítica of the Unión de Escritores y Artistas de Cuba, for her current work in progress, a book of essays entitled, *Un país para narrar*.
